Registration and Accreditation

We received our non-profit licence from the Ministry of Commerce on September 25, 2007. This has helped raise interest in our institution from corporate sponsors and we have received sponsorship for two students so far.

After visits from both the Independent Schools Unit and the Special Education Unit of the Ministry of Education our provisional registration was converted to full and final registration on May 14, 2008. Our staff and students are all to be congratulated in their contribution to this effort.
